Carpe Occasionem



A bunch of years ago I was walking through a parking lot. As I approached my car, I saw that a group of people were gathered around the driver's seat of a car near mine. I could tell that whoever was in that seat was in some sort of health distress,

and I could hear sirens in the distance. I loaded my purchases into my car and looked back at the group of people. I felt strongly led to pray for them so I got into my car and began to pray. Then I began to cry – surprisingly.... tears simply poured while I prayed. I sat there praying until the ambulance arrived and then for a bit more.

That might be the most dramatic time I was led to pray for someone but it is by far not the only time. I've been woken up in the middle of the night, or overwhelmed with concern or, moved to prayer through persistent thoughts and even while driving when certain individuals are brought to mind.

Now, I have no idea who was in the car that day, I have no idea what the problem was, I have no idea why I was so strongly moved to pray and I have no idea how it all turned out — and I have no idea why it all invoked tears. I do know that I feel I was in the right place at the right time to be blessed with an opportunity to pray for someone who was in need. I'll probably never know. I know that I will likely never know the who, what, where, when, and why of the circumstances, but I don't need to know. It is enough to have prayed, for whomever, for whatever.

This all brings to mind Esther. Have ya ever read the Book of Esther? You should! Esther was instrumental at a critical time in God's plan for Persia. The key scripture upon which the entire book turns is when Mordecai implores Esther saying "Do not think that because you are in the king's house you alone of all the Jews will escape. For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to royal position for such a time as this?" Esther 4:13,14.

We would do well to learn from the experiences of Esther and Mordecai. Mordecai's life is filled with challenges that he turned into opportunities. Notes found in the Life Application Bible include these two points about lessons from Mordecai's life:

- 1) "The opportunities we have are more important than the ones we wish we had." God's opportunities will present themselves in a myriad of ways. We must remain open to his leading, to the possibilities of a life of service to Him. You never know when you may be called to pray, or act, or offer a kind word, or whatever
- 2) God is using the situations you face each day to weave a pattern of godliness into your character. Pause and ask God to help you respond appropriately to the situations you find yourself in today. Even if it is to simply sit in your car and pray while someone else is in distress. Because who knows..... perhaps you are here for a time such as this.

Summer Camps have long been a vital ministry of the United Methodist Church in NYS. We are excited to share 2023 summer camp and retreat opportunities with you!


