FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

2024



When I was in 8th grade, something happened to me that radically changed the direction of my life. I was a church kid, and we were attending a local Baptist church where the gospel was preached and the Bible was central, but church was a Sunday event, and the rest of the week was focused on school and other activities. There were Sunday clothes and Sunday faith.

A ragtag storefront group formed in our small village, comprised of energetic—even peculiar—people who wanted to live excitedly for Jesus 24/7. Our family had learned about the Holy Spirit at the Baptist church, but with an understanding that miracles, prophecies, and inspired utterances were actions that ceased with the passing of the early apostles and the original church. This limiting constriction of the Holy Spirit did not go over well with the hyper-expectant-recently-saved believers who came to town!

What happened to me was that I came to understand that there was so much more to the Christian life than keeping rules and slugging off to church each week out of habit. I opened myself up to what is known as the “baptism of the Holy Spirit,” or the “filling of the Spirit.” A door opened, a light went on, and the idea of personal transformation and empowerment eventually propelled me into ministry. And yes, there were detours and backslidings along the way!

This month I am beginning a sermon series based on the book in the New Testament that documents the “acts of the apostles.” In it, we see the birthing of the church of Jesus Christ, and the necessity of the enduement of power beyond what these quite human vessels could accomplish. I invite us not to replicate the acts we find in the book, but to ask ourselves, “What does the Holy Spirit want to do in my life and in our church at this time, in 2024?” Will you go on this journey with me?

As an epilogue, my parents—life-long Baptists—also received a renewing touch of the Spirit in their lives at a large, thriving, youth-filled, charismatic United Methodist church in Tampa, Florida. So much about our lives and our family changed because of the discovery that there was “something more.”

Happy New Year!

There's something about standing at the precipice of a new year isn't there... it's like we've hit the refresh button on our brain browser, and we are filled with renewed resolve. I liken it to a clean sheet of paper. I like to write and there is something exciting about the pristine, blank page... even though it appears empty it is filled with possibilities.

A few days ago, I was looking online at a devotional that offered a new word every day to pray on and ponder. I liked that idea but didn't think that I needed to spend \$15 on it so I pretty quickly dismissed it. The idea stayed with me though and I find it coming out of my fingers onto this page.

So here is the idea... Rather than consider a word a day, I'm going to offer a word a week. These words, chosen as the Spirit leads, will be in the newsletter either as a part of my article or included on another page. This first newsletter is for January and February, so I'll offer 8 words to begin with along with a scripture reference and a quote that speaks to that word. I would suggest that we first look the word up in the dictionary and then apply the S.O.A.P. approach to our pondering and prayers on the word. **Scripture Observation Application Prayer.** **Scripture:** I'll offer one scripture reference. But don't just read the specified verse read the verses around it so that you understand the context. Also, most Bibles include a concordance so by all means spend some time and look up scriptures and read them. I think we'll be amazed at some of the things we discover. **Observation:** During the week as we contemplate and pray asking God to show us the intricacies of His Word through our word of the week write down what the Holy Spirit reveals to you. **Application:** This is putting what you discover into action. Ask God to show you where and how to apply the word of the week in accordance with His Word. **Prayer:** Invite the Holy Spirit into your prayer time and be open to new revelations. I guarantee you'll have some. Here are the 8 words for Jan/Feb 2024.

Resolve - Scripture: Romans 5:1-5 Quote: "Resolve and thou art free." - Henry Wadsworth Longfellow.

Gratitude - Scripture: 1Thessalonians 5:16-18 Quote: "Gratitude makes sense of our past, brings peace for today, and creates a vision for tomorrow." Melody Beattie

Light - Scripture: John 1:5 Quote: "Following the light of the sun, we left the Old World." - Christopher Columbus

Habit - Scripture: Hebrews 10:24-25 Quote: "Stop the habit of wishful thinking and start the habit of thoughtful wishes." - Mary Martin

New - Scripture: 2Corinthians 5:17 Quote: "A person who never made a mistake never tried anything new." Albert Einstein

Patience - Scripture: Colossians 3:12-13 Quote: "Patience is not simply the ability to wait - it's how we behave while we're waiting." Joyce Meyer

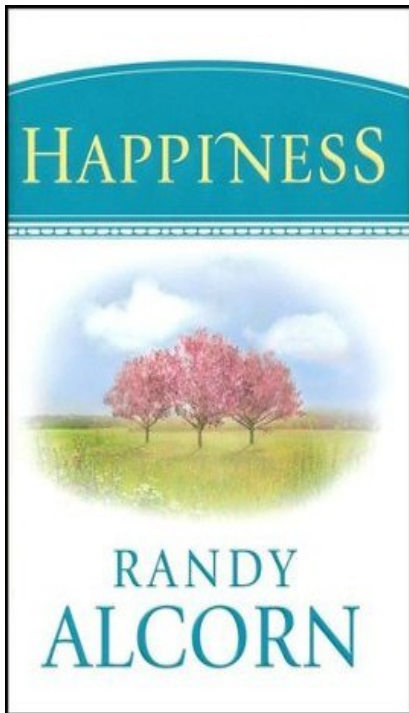
