

On Sunday, February 25, my retirement from Lyndonville United Methodist Church was announced, effective June 30, 2024. I had an earlier season of retirement that was interrupted by the desire to return to ministry. So, this is a return to retirement, but not necessarily time for reclining in a rocking chair and gazing into the sunset. It is retirement part-two.

This has been a unique experience for both you and me! My church background is not United Methodist; our family attended Baptist, Mennonite, and Assembly of God churches. The one connection with the UMC—a significant one—was my parent's encounter with a large dynamic Methodist church in Tampa, Florida, which led them into a new dimension of Spirit-filled faith. We lived on "the Ridge" at the time—only about fifteen minutes from Lyndonville—and my parents, my sister and I were growing in our walk with the Lord. Ministry was just beginning for me, even at Royalton-Hartland school, where I graduated from. Now as I look back, I realize how quickly life seems to have gone by so far. Some of you can relate to that feeling.

Each church I have served has been unique. My first church was a small inner-city group that met in a storefront in a lively Buffalo neighborhood, then we moved to a more poor and dangerous section for several years. Much of my career was spent in the Mennonite church (modern), where the values of simplicity, peace, and service challenged me to be a more authentic believer. Church of the Brethren and American Baptist USA churches followed, and then more recently I have been part of the UMC. Being a pastor has been a privilege, although there was some stumbling, periodic frustrations, and seasons of loneliness along the way. All in all, it has been good.

Thank-you for welcoming me here! You have blessed me with your encouragement, your faithfulness in service, and acceptance of a Baptist/Mennonite as your pastor. Those of you of a certain age know about arriving at the place in life where you realize that you have only so many years left. So, I desire to enjoy a bit more carefree routine, possibly return to my roots in the city, and discover connections with people in church and community.

May we all move forward in these last few months with hope in our steps. Let us trust God and remain faithful. Perhaps God wants to do a "new thing" here in our midst.

Upon meeting with the DS to begin the discussion around finding a new pastor the SPRC asked for help. In response to asking for help we will be working with a team from the district to conduct a ministry assessment.

What is a ministry assessment or a ministry audit?

It is simply an evaluation process intended to identify our strengths and weaknesses, our challenges and our unique opportunities and potential as a congregation.

The process takes a few weeks and is carried out over a series of 4 church gatherings. The first of these gatherings will be held on Sunday April 14 at 2:00 pm here at the church.

We will meet with members of the district ministry audit team and begin the assessment process.
