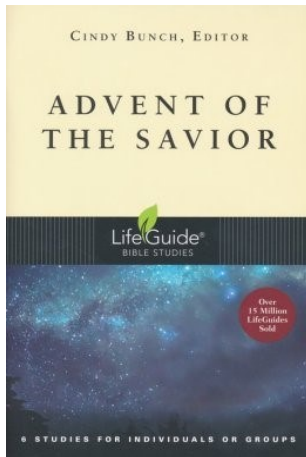

Gr8ful!

Coming home from vacation last week proved to be an exercise in patience, persistence and prayer. Leaving Rodanthe early to catch our flight at Norfolk airport we were about 40 minutes from our destination when a warning sound went off in our rental van and the left rear tire began to lose air faster than you can say “uh oh, we might not make our flight.”

We pulled off into a safe area and over the next half hour tried to resuscitate the tire. The van was equipped with a fairly cheap emergency tire kit but no spare. The kit was designed to seal and inflate the tire... albeit slowly. That exercise bought us about another 3 miles down the road where we found a station and pumped it up again. A couple of miles later we had to stop again, and again. We contacted the rental company, who offered no real assistance, but told us we could try “Fix-a-Flat.” So we did. We could see the goop oozing out of the tire as we were putting it in. we started out again hoping that driving it a couple of miles would “seal” the tire. Nope, we pulled off again not much closer to the airport. This time however the area we pulled of also had a Firestone Service area. They looked at the tire and replaced it quickly and told us they’d bill the rental company. We were back on the road within an hour. We did however have to change our flights which made a day that began at 5:30 a.m. extremely exhausting. I finally arrived home at 12:15 am.

Although that day was stressful, didn’t go anywhere near as planned, resulting in long waits in airports, sore butts and mental exhaustion, how could I be anything but grateful. We arrived safely, we received a significant amount of assistance and grace from several directions along the way. It could have turned out much worse.

Scripture tells us to be grateful, 1Thessalonians 5:18; “Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.” It’s easy to be thankful when things are going well. Maybe not so much when life is hard, and stressful, grace seems impossible – both received and offered to others. But gratitude and grace are never impossible – we simply need to choose them. We can turn to the Bible examples...

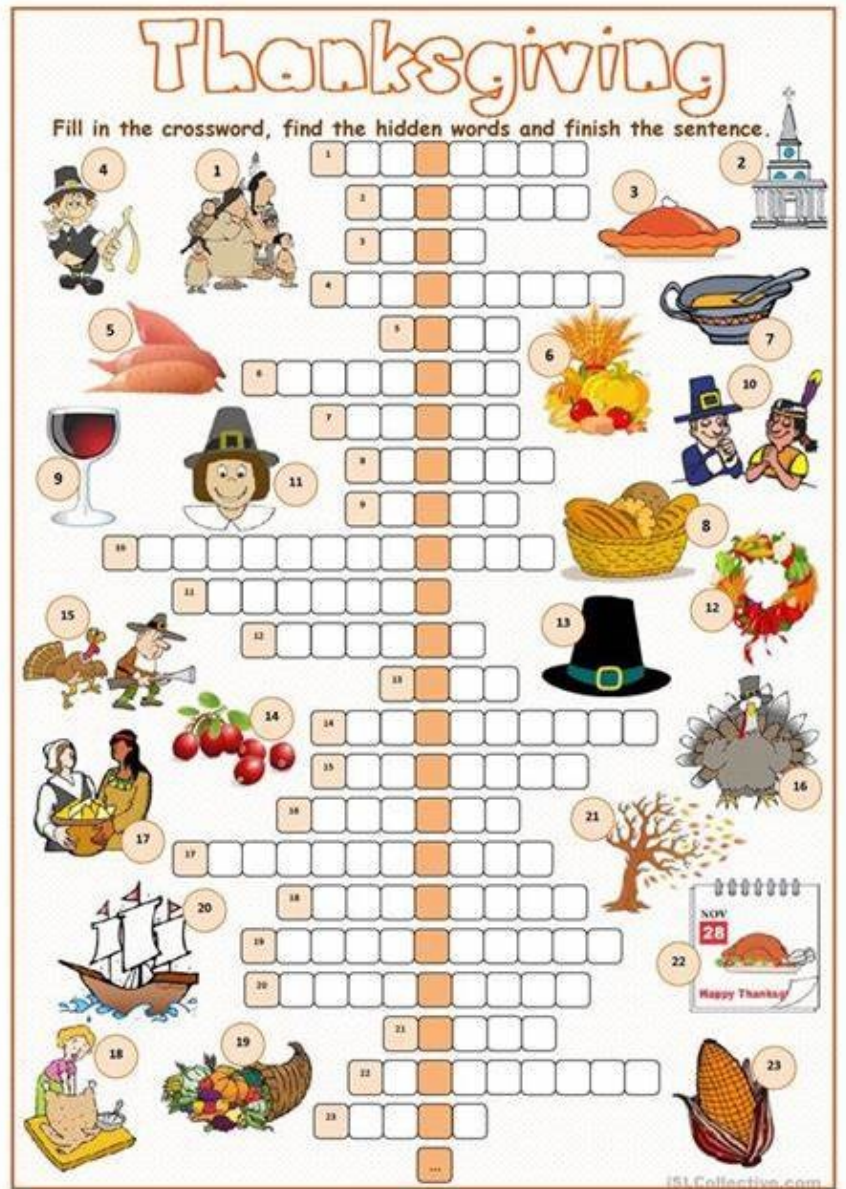
- * Joseph is thrown into a pit by his brothers... he endures a variety of hardships and blessings... ultimately he gives thanks to God because God allowed it all for ultimate good. (Genesis 37-48)
- * Daniel is exiled from his homeland and enslaved at a young age. He resists indoctrination into the Babylonian culture putting his life at risk, yet, he fasts and prays giving thanks three times a day, choosing hope over despair. (Daniel)
- * Jonah is swallowed by a huge fish and at the risk of becoming whale vomit offers repentance and thanks from its belly. (Jonah)
- * Paul offers songs of praise and prayers from prison. (Acts 16)
- * Having learned that his cousin John has been beheaded and faced with feeding a crowd of 5000 with only five loaves and two fish... Jesus gives thanks **before** there was enough to go around. (Matthew 14)

In each and every one of these examples Joseph, Daniel, Jonah, Paul and Jesus, no matter the circumstances and how matter how they got where they were, first chose to look to God, trusting that God would provide. So can we.
